#### Thank you to Alverton School from Ella Upton

Ella, a former pupil at Alverton School, is spending three weeks this summer building a children's playground in Uganda in a project run by the charity East African Playgrounds, which helps some of the most vulnerable children in the world.

Last week's non-uniform day raised £204.75 towards her trip which costs £2,500. The money raised will go to the charity towards the purchase of swings, bikes and other playground equipment. During her stay Ella will be put up by local families. Working alongside other volunteers, Ella will spend almost two weeks building a playground, before spending two days visiting a gorilla conservation project. She will then take part in a creative play project.

Ella says: "I want to say a big thank you to everyone at Alverton School. I am very grateful for Alverton's support. The money will make a real impact. These children have nothing and research shows how play can make a real difference to their lives."

"To give people an idea of where the money you donate goes; £15 = a play motorbike (also known as a Boda Boda); £20 = full safety equipment for one member of staff; £85 = a relaxation and games area in a playground; £250 = an obstacle course for children to climb, jump and hide; £500 = three swing sets with 4 seats on each; £800 = Educational Play training course delivered to 16 schools."

#### For information:

A general breakdown of the costs involved in Ella's trip is given below: £400 - goes towards a Gorilla Permit, purchased from the Ugandan Wildlife Authority, a charity that work on conservation of Ugandan national parks and look after the endangered silverback gorillas; £500 - goes towards accommodation, including money given to the Home of Edirisa, a social enterprise that works on building up the communities and towns. They have, for example, built a swimming pool on Lake Bunyoni for children to learn to swim safely; £1000 - goes towards East African Playgrounds, who employ over 40 Ugandan staff and have built over 100 playgrounds across Uganda, Rwanda and Kenya, including 8 playgrounds in refugee camps, helping some of the most vulnerable children in the world. (A breakdown of the costs of play equipment are listed above). £800 travel costs

#### Wraparound Childcare provided by Go Active at Alverton School.

We are delighted to be able to offer all students at Alverton School a wraparound childcare service

#### between 3.15pm until 6.15pm, starting after May Half Term!

This service will provide children with the opportunity to complete **daily homework**, such as reading, spelling and maths, as well **as participating in a variety of physical activities**. These activities will vary throughout the week, from traditional sports such as football, touch rugby and basketball, through to the more alternative activities that Go Active Cornwall offer, such as Fencing, Street Surfing, Rocketball, Urban Polo and Tchoukball. In addition to this, we will also provide other activities which will vary throughout the week. We have attached a timetable below to give you all a basic understanding of how the wraparound club would run, and what you could expect your child/children to participate in if they attended the club.

We will run a very flexible club to fit around parents/guardian's work/other commitments. To try and cater for all your requirements, we are offering one, two or three hours of childcare at a time daily throughout the working week. We also offer sibling discount. A breakdown of the fees is listed below:

We will be invoicing parents who have children using our wraparound childcare service **on a weekly basis** via email &/or paper based. When paying an invoice, please state the invoice number so we can update our records.

During your children's time with us at our childcare service, we will provide all children with the opportunity to have a variety of fruit, toast and other snacks, as well as a drink, which will vary throughout the week.

After looking over the information provided, call into the office for an application form and please can you tick the boxes of the day(s) and time(s) you require, followed by your child's details. Once this has been completed, please hand back in to the office.

NB: If more than one child, please fill in one sheet per child and clearly indicate this when handing the forms back to ensure the sibling discount is applied.
