

### Governor Responsibilities

Governors are for the most part people with jobs of their own who are not expected to run the school on a day-to-day basis. The governors' role is largely a strategic one.

Governors are supporters of the school and often described as "critical friends". When a governor comes into school, it is to learn and not to judge.

The history of the school governor is rooted in the belief that good education is not just a matter for educationalists and that it must be balanced with the views, opinions and experiences of people who exist outside of the classroom.

Everyone on the governing body will have a mixture of skills, and a good governing body will have a broad mixture of different skills and qualities.

The Governing Body is responsible for:

**Strategic View** – Values, Mission, Vision

**Critical Friend** - Monitoring and evaluating school improvement

**Ensure Accountability** – High Standards, value for money, agreed aims and objectives

### Key Tasks

- To know and contribute to the school's vision, its current goals and its development priorities.
- To attend Full Governors meetings at least once in each term.
- To be part of at least one Governor focus area and to attend meetings and contribute to decision making as appropriate.
- To undertake the responsibilities of monitoring visits, often focusing on a key priority linked to the School Development Plan.
- To hold a specific role or responsibility as required.

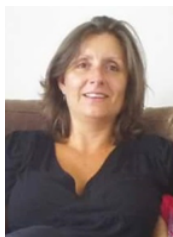
