

Dear Parents

Thank you to everyone who has responded to the Travel Plan Survey by completing the questionnaire. We received 118 completed forms which covered 162 children. This is a very significant return for this type of survey and reflects the strength of feeling which exists about this issue in our school community. A copy of the survey report along with our planned actions is attached to the Newsletter, it can also be found on the school website.

We have had a similarly positive response from parents to the traffic control measures introduced this week. I am very grateful indeed to all of the parents who have responded so positively to our attempts to stop traffic entering Toltuff Road and Crescent at the beginning and end of the school day. We intend to continue to have staff on patrol at this junction and would ask for your continued support in parking in one of the surrounding roads and walking the short distance to the school grounds.

Obviously the weather will not always be as fine as it has been this week. We would therefore suggest that parents arrive in good time to park and walk on wet days and that you keep a brolly in the car! In many ways it is even more important that cars do not attempt to drive close to the school on days when the weather is inclement as poor visibility and road conditions make children even more vulnerable around traffic.



As the great Alfred Wainwright said, "There is no such thing as bad weather, only unsuitable clothing." And being from the Lake District he knew a thing or two about wet weather walking!

Staffing Update

Attendance

Whilst the vast majority of pupils have really good levels of attendance and only take time off when they are unwell, we do have a number of children who are what DfE call 'persistent absentees'. These are children who have attendance below 90%, which equates to missing half a day every week across the school year. Children with attendance below 90% are shown to be much less likely to achieve as well as they should by the end of Key Stage 2 and indeed in their GCSEs etc.

We have produced the poster below to show that, although education at our school is rightly free for children to access, it is not actually free to provide. In fact it costs approximately £30 per day for each pupil to attend our school, which is £150 a week and £5960 a year. The point we are making is that missing 10% or more of the school year is a huge waste on every level. In fact, whilst parents of children with attendance below 90% may face prosecution with the possibility of fines or even custodial sentences, it is the children who could be paying a much heavier price for many years to come.
