Single Equality Scheme

Every Spring term we write to all parents about the Single Equality Scheme. This addresses our statutory duties in relation to race, disability, gender and promoting community cohesion and covers staff, pupils and people using the services of the school such as parents. The Single Equality Scheme also addresses the legislation relating to religion or belief, age and sexual orientation and includes our priorities and actions to eliminate discrimination and harassment for these equality areas.

The scheme requires us to produce an annual report on our progress, looking at the impact of our actions. A "Single Equality Scheme Guide for Parents" is attached to this week's newsletter which includes the report on our progress towards our key objectives for 2016 – 2017. Staffing update

This half term, we have sadly said goodbye to Mrs Trahair who has been working at Alverton for 11 years as a Teaching Assistant and Lunchtime Supervisor, and more recently as an Admin Assistant, helping Mrs Gill in the office. She is off to work in a job outside education. We will miss her and wish her every success for the future.

Attendance

To support our work improving school attendance, Mrs Daylak is available to answer any questions you might have regarding attendance, absences and holidays, after school every Tuesday until 4pm. She can be found in Robins

classroom.

Late collection after school

Although almost all of our children are collected promptly at the end of the school day, we are finding that an increasing number of parents have struggled recently to pick their children up at 3.15pm. This has resulted in up to twenty children waiting outside the office to be collected on some days. We now need to put changes in place which ensure that your children are safe and supervised until they are collected and we hope that this will help those parents who find themselves in this position.

After half-term, we are going to run a "Buffer" facility until 3.45pm. If you are not able to collect your child at 3.15pm, we will take them to the Library. Parents arriving to collect their children after this time will need to sign in at Reception in the usual way and make their way to the Library.

As we need to ensure that the children are appropriately supervised, we will of course have to pay a member of staff to do so. If your child needs to use this facility, there will be cost of £2 each day. You are, of course, able to collect them at any time between 3.15pm and 3.45pm (and we anticipate that parents will collect their children as soon as possible) but the cost will remain the same. We must stress that it is **essential that your child is collected by 3.45pm at the latest** as there will not be a member of staff to supervise them after this time.

For safeguarding reasons, it is very important that we know which children will be collected late each day and will be using this facility. Please could you ensure that you have called into, or telephoned, the office to let them know in advance. If your child is not collected at 3.15pm and we are expecting them to be, we will take them to the Library but the cost will be £4 if they have not been "booked in". Where parents have more than one child, we will offer a reduced rate of £1 for subsequent children.

We would remind parents that the school day ends at 3.15pm. However, we really do understand that sometimes it is impossible to collect your children at this time and that some parents have requested the flexibility of an arrangement such as this. Our priority is always to keep your children safe and so we hope that you will find this solution to be helpful.

Parents Evenings

We are going to use our system for booking appointments through our eschools facility on our school website (www.alverton.org.uk) as we did last Autumn. A letter with more details will come home after half term.

You will previously have been sent log in details for eschools. If you are unsure what this is, please ask at the office and they will arrange for new details to be sent to you. These details will be needed in order to go online and book the appointment slot that suits you best when the booking period opens on the 22nd February.

If you usually have a review meeting with Mrs Hughes and your child's class teacher, you will be sent an appointment time as normal and you don't need to use the eschools system. Ducklings Nursery parents will also not need to use this.

Changes to clubs after half term

Please note that if your child has a place after half term for a particular club such as Archery (£20), Art (£10) or Dance (£10) the clubs will start as soon as we get back in the week beginning 20th February. If you haven't yet paid for your club, please do so before the first one so that your child can take part.

Please note Fencing will not continue after half term due to lack of demand. Archery club is now full.

All other clubs will continue as normal after half term, starting on Monday 20th February.

Advance notice of club cancellations

All teacher-led clubs will be cancelled in the week beginning Monday 6th March due to parent teacher meetings. This will affect Football, Needlecraft, Glee, Story Club, both Choirs, Drama, High Fives and Board games.
