Art/D.T.

In Art lessons, we will be using collage to produce water inspired art. We will also all be trying our hand at some classic watery paintings like The Great Wave and work by Monet.

In D.T. we will be investigating, building and testing different styles of bridge.

Science

In our Science lessons for the Spring Term, we all be learning about animals including humans, focussing on the circulatory system and how the heart and lungs work in the human body. We will be linking this work to our work on healthy living in P.S.H.E. We will also looking at waterborne diseases and how scientists have made the world a safer

PSHE

The theme this term is sex and relationship education. Y5 and Y6 will be looking at some shared and some different units based around this topic. Parents will have the opportunity to see any of the resources to be used before we start should they wish.

In the first half-term and specifically what it means to be a Moslem in Britain. After the break we will be learning about Christianity and specifically how Jesus helps Christians.

Where do you spend a penny?

This project will delve into the murky waters of our sewage systems. We will discover how our water is cleaned and the science behind disease. We will find out which countries do not have access to clean water and how charities help them. As a final outcome, we hope to raise money to help water charities.

Maths

In our maths lessons, we will continue to improve our calculation strategies and then move on to use these skills to solve problems involving fractions, decimals and percentages, money, measures, ratio and proportion and angles. We will also practise drawing graphs and charts and plotting points on graphs.

Geography

This term our Geography will be a Physical Geography unit focussing on water and how it has shaped the landscapes around us. In particular, we will investigate how water has sculpted our coasts and river systems. We will also look at how and when monsoons occur and how too much, or to little water can affect people's lives.



British Values

We will look at individual liberty in relation to human rights and choices connected to the access to water.

English

In English, the Year 5s and 6s will be working from different programmes of study. Year 5 will be doing water poetry, a Shakespeare unit, writing an explanation and our favourite Titanic unit.
