Dear Parents/Carers

On Tuesday of this week I held two parents meetings to share the findings of our 360° School Survey and to outline the main priorities for school development which have emerged from this. I am grateful to those parents who attended these meetings and who showed such enthusiasm for the vision we have for the school.

This survey, which took the views of all staff, children and parents across the school, will be an annual event to help us retain a clear focus on the areas we need to improve. It will also help us to measure the success of changes and developments across each year.

I have included a short overview on how all of the areas identified for development will fit into a plan across the year from the start of the Summer Term 2015.

Whilst much of my focus will be on what we need to improve and add into the school development plan, it is perhaps worth reflecting on the areas of the survey which reinforced and underlined the aspects of the school which were rated most highly by those surveyed.

For parents, the **highest scoring** answers were in response to the following statements:

I believe that my child is well taught at school  
My child is well looked after at school.  
I feel that the staff are committed to the school and care for my child.  
I would recommend the school to other parents.  
My child feels safe at school.

One of the really interesting aspects of the survey was the fact that the weakest areas of the school being identified by staff, parents and pupils had a great deal of overlap and commonality.

The main areas identified by staff, pupils and parents **for improvement** were:

School meals at lunchtime  
The playgrounds and outdoor environment  
Improved IT resources  
Clearer Rewards and Sanctions

There are comprehensive plans in place to improve all of the areas identified as quickly as possible. Our Governors are, for example, in the process of looking at ways in which school meals and IT resources can be improved as a matter of some urgency. In addition, a new Rewards and Sanctions system has been developed and agreed by staff during this term and will be announced to pupils and parents immediately after Easter. I am confident that this new rewards system will be really popular with pupils and parents.

Perhaps the biggest challenge is in making improvements to the outdoor environment of the school. As you will be aware we have held two community events to improve access for pupils to the fantastic natural environment which the school enjoys. The two 'Big Digs' have seen staff and parents transform two woodland areas into inspirational outdoor spaces for children to enjoy.

Indeed, this morning (Thursday) saw the official opening of our Nursery woodland space as parents and their nursery aged children took part in various Easter activities in the woodland after an opening ceremony led by our very special guest, Miss Olga Collier. Miss Collier was one of the original teachers to work at Alverton School when it opened in 1955 and went on to be Headteacher at Mousehole, Nansloe and Alverton before becoming the Chief Inspector of Schools for Cornwall in the 1970s. I would like to thank all of those parents who attended this event, Miss Collier, as well as Miss Caddick and all of those who worked so hard to create this magnificent learning space.
