Dear Parents and Carers

Thanks again to everyone for supporting our attempts to keep the area outside of the school relatively traffic free at key drop-off and pick-up times. The feedback from parents and residents has been very positive indeed and our intention is to continue to have a patrol at the junction of Toltuff Road and Trevena Road. For any parents who are unsure where to park, there is a car park by Alverton Free Church which is marked on the map below with a red X. This is, as you will see, only a short walk from the school.



We have arranged for the School Crossing service to conduct an assessment after half-term with a view to getting a manned crossing on Trevena Road as this is clearly another area of potential risk. There is no guarantee of being able to secure funding for a manned crossing as it will depend upon the number of pedestrians trying to cross Trevena Road and the number of cars using the road at that time, but we will do our best. Obviously, the more people who walk to school the stronger our case. We are also trying to push for some traffic calming measures around this busy junction.

Finally, in response to the large number of people who indicated that they would like to use a Walking Bus to and from the Free Church Car Park, we are looking to re-establish this during the next half term. We will look to use a member of staff to co-ordinate and lead this but will need volunteer parents to commit to walk with the bus on a rota basis in order to ensure that we have the correct ratio of adults to children. If you would be willing to volunteer to be on a rota for the walking bus we would ask you to please complete the slip on the fourth page and return it to the school office. Without enough parental support to help operate a Walking Bus, we will not be able to do this. Thank you.
