
Parent Helpers

If you are currently not receiving the Friday News by email and would like to, please let us have your email address and we will send it out to you. Please note that it sometimes disappears into your Spam folder so please check there first before letting us know that you haven't received it.

Breakfast Club

We are pleased to announce some important changes to our Breakfast Club offer. The club will continue to run from 8am each day and the charge will remain at £2 per session.

However, from next Monday (September 21st), Breakfast Club will operate as a **flexible 'pay as you use'** provision, i.e. there will be **no need to book** in advance. If you can let us know though, this is very helpful to the Breakfast Club staff. **Sessions must, however, be paid for either in advance or on the day of use.**

Children who are entitled to **Pupil Premium** funding will be able to attend Breakfast Club each day free of charge.

To try to help **working parents**, we will charge £2 for the first child and £1 for siblings (e.g. £4 for 3 children).

To help children get off to a **healthy start** to the day, we are introducing some new clubs which will operate from 8am. Children taking part in these will also be able to enjoy a breakfast before they start school. The first of these is a Yoga Club which will operate on Friday mornings. Because we are buying in professional coaches there will be a charge for some of these clubs (free for Pupil Premium children), and places in the classes are limited.

We are also increasing the number of staff who will run the Breakfast Club which will enable us to increase the range of activities we offer and the spaces we use around the school which will increase the number of children we can accommodate.

To give you the full details on this, we are sending home a Parent Guide to our Breakfast Club with this Newsletter.
