Welcome back to school for the start of the 2019 Autumn Term at Alverton. The Summer holidays now seem a long time ago, term is well underway and the children have all settled in fantastically to their new classes. Thank you for making sure that your children came back for the new year with very positive attitudes and looking so smart in their school uniforms.

We have been pleased to welcome quite a few new children into school this year, as well as two new teachers. Miss Hooton has joined the EYFS team and will be teaching alongside Mrs Daylak in Reception while Miss Rudge begins her teaching career with Trencrom Class. We are delighted that they have joined our team and are sure that they will be great assets to the school.

As always, the staff have been busy planning a range of engaging activities and topics for the new term including some very creative launch days. Years 5 and 6 have begun their "What is the Point of Pyramids?" topic by training to be archaeologists for Howard Carter. Years 3 and 4 enjoyed a range of food and sport-related activities with an Ancient Egyptian theme and Years 1 and 2 are planning an Explorer Day on the field next week.

Some of the biggest changes this summer have been happening over at the Woodlands Nursery where building work has enabled their pre-school room and our nursery class to work much more closely together in a single space. This has been transformed and the team of staff are working together led by Mrs Hall to create a fantastic provision for our very youngest children.

We look forward to working with you and your children over the coming year; if you have any concerns or questions at all, please make an appointment to see your child's class teacher who will be able to help.

### Keeping Children Safe at Alverton School

Keeping children safe is a key part of what we all do. Our website has a Safeguarding section which contains lots of information. In addition, you can pick up a Parent Guide (which is also sent with this newsletter) from our reception which also has leaflets containing other important safeguarding information. Last term we sent the first of our termly Safeguarding newsletters – look out for the Autumn Term newsletter later in the term.

At Alverton, the Designated Safeguarding Lead is Mr Higgs and the Deputy DSL is Mrs Wicks who are both always available to meet with you should you be concerned about a child's safety in any way.

## Traffic and parking

Please could we inform all new parents and remind all our existing ones that to keep our children, parents and residents safe, we would prefer you not to drive down Toltuff Crescent. There is a free church car park at the Hope Church which you are welcome to park in which is only a few minutes walk away. There are also a number of nearby roads which are perfectly situated for parking in and we ask you to park considerately in these. Both the car parks at the school are for permit holders only. All roads in this area have a speed limit of 20mph and we ask that you observe this for safety reasons.



## Early Morning arrangements

Now that the term is under way and your children have settled into their new classes, we would like to remind parents that children in Year 1 and above should be left at the hall door each morning.

We realise that many of our Year 1 children are used to having the additional support of their parents in escorting them into class and completely understand that, for some children, coming in on their own can take a bit of time. There will be members of staff available at the door to work with you towards helping the children to come into school independently.

## **School lunches**

The current menu runs until the end of October. Spare copies are available at the office. Jacket potatoes and sandwiches are always available daily.

**Please pay either on the day or in advance** either by cash or cheque (payable to 'Caterlink') as debts cannot be accrued. Unfortunately Caterlink do not, as yet, offer an online payment system. The cost has increased to £2.32 per day and they no longer offer juice. Water is always available.

All Reception children and Year 1 and 2 are eligible for a free lunch under the Government's Universal Free School Meals initiative. A reminder to Year 3 parents that payment must be made for meals from now on. If you think your child is entitled to free school meals, please contact the office for more information.

## **Wellies and coats!**

Please ensure that your child has a pair of named wellies in school at all times and a coat so that they can use the field at breaktimes and lunchtimes.

## **Water bottles**

Please can you ensure that your child brings a water bottle to school with them each day. It is important that the children drink plenty of water.

## **Alverton water bottles**

We now have reusable water bottles for sale at the office priced £1.50 (cash only please). They are in house colours (red, blue, green & yellow) so please ask your child which one they belong to so they can have the correct coloured bottle.

## **Absence from school**

If your child is unwell or will not be attending school it is your responsibility to contact the school on the first day of absence no later than 9.30am (there is an answering machine if you wish to leave a message before 8am). If we have not heard from you by this time we will need to telephone home to ascertain the nature of your child's absence. This is in line with the Government's policy on attendance. Please note that any child who is ill with sickness or an upset stomach should remain away from school for 48 hours after the last episode of illness.

## **Uniform**

Whilst the weather remains warm, children are welcome to wear the summer uniform (red checked dresses) until half term. Grey shorts may be worn all year round.

## **PE kit**

**All** children from Years 1-6 should have a PE kit in school all week. This should consist of a pair of red shorts, white polo shirt or T-shirt, red zipped Alverton top, black tracksuit bottoms and a pair of trainers. These should be named and in a named PE bag or other bag. Although there are set days during the week for PE, other sessions can take place at any time during the week and children should not be disadvantaged by not having the appropriate kit to wear.

## **Clubs**

All clubs start next Monday 16th (except Drama club which begins on Tuesday 24th) and if your child put in a clubs form, they should have received it back showing which clubs they are doing. Many clubs have long waiting lists so if your child does not commit to attending regularly, their place will be given to the next person on the list. If your child is not attending a club for any reason, please let us know so that this can be put on the club's register for that day.

If your club requires payment, please ensure that it is received before the date of the first club or your child will not be able to be start.

Please collect your child promptly at the end of their club. If you are going to be late to collect them, please contact Go Active to book them into their after school provision on 07843 126833.

## **Applying for a school place for September 2020**

If you have a child born between 1st September 2015 and 31st August 2016 you need to apply for a school place in a Reception class for starting in September 2020. The deadline for applications is 15th January 2020. The easiest way is to apply online at [www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions](http://www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions). ## **Transfer to Secondary School**

If your child is currently in Year 6, you need to apply for their place at your preferred secondary school by 31st October 2019.
