#### Staffing update

#### **Single Equality Scheme**

Every Spring term we write to all parents about the Single Equality Scheme. This addresses our statutory duties in relation to race, disability, gender and promoting community cohesion and covers staff, pupils and people using the services of the school such as parents. The Single Equality Scheme also addresses the legislation relating to religion or belief, age and sexual orientation and includes our priorities and actions to eliminate discrimination and harassment for these equality areas.

The scheme requires us to produce an annual report on our progress, looking at the impact of our actions. A "Single Equality Scheme Guide for Parents" is attached to this week's newsletter which includes the report on our progress towards our key objectives for the last year. The guide also asks anyone interested in being part of our ongoing consultation to get in touch with one of the Senior Leadership Team – if you are interested, we would be delighted to hear from you.

#### Visitors

#### Headlice

Headlice have been reported in at least three classes this week. Please be vigilant about checking your child's hair regularly and treating any headlice promptly if you find them. There are helpful leaflets outside the office if you need more information.

#### Breakfast club and school drop offs

Please note that school does not open for Breakfast club before 8am and there is no provision for your child's care before then. Please do not drop them off earlier than 8am if they are going to Breakfast club. The school doors open for the start of school at 8.45am. Please do not drop your child off unaccompanied before then.

#### Pupil's Bringing Mobile Phones into School (extract from our Mobile Phone Policy)

While we fully understand some parents' wish to allow their child to bring a mobile phone to school if they walk to and from school without adult supervision, Alverton discourages pupils bringing mobile phones to school due to the potential issues caused through misuse, access to unfiltered websites, access social media applications and damage or loss of these expensive devices.


If you decide that your child needs to bring a phone into school, a permission slip (overleaf) must be signed by the parent and the phone must be left in the school office at the start of the day and collected at the end of the day. Phones should be clearly marked so that each pupil knows their own phone. Parents are advised that Alverton accepts no liability for the loss or damage to mobile phones which are brought into school or school grounds.

Where a pupil is found by a member of staff to be using a mobile phone, the phone will be confiscated from the pupil and handed to a member of the office team who will record the name of the pupil and attach it to the phone. The mobile phone will be stored by the school office. The pupil may collect the phone at the end of the school day. A letter will be sent home to parents requesting that a permission slip be returned the next day. If this practice continues, then the school will confiscate the phone until an appropriate adult collects the phone from a senior teacher.

If a pupil is found taking photographs or video footage with a mobile phone on the school site, this will be regarded as a serious offence and disciplinary action will be taken according to our Behaviour policy.

If images of other pupils or teacher have been taken, the phone will not be returned to the pupil until the images have been removed by the pupil in the presence of a senior teacher.

Parents are reminded that the Terms and Conditions of many social media sites restrict their usage to young people of at least 13 years of age. The table below gives examples of the current age limits for some of the most popular sites in use at the time of writing this policy. **The school will therefore not allow phones which have any social media applications or age restricted software into school.** Where it is believed that phones may have such applications on the we will contact parents and ask them to collect them from the school office. These phones should not then be brought into school again until the applications/software causing concern have been deleted or removed.



Should a pupil be found to be using their phone inappropriately, the school reserves the right to withdraw this privilege and they will no longer be able to bring a phone into school.

Should parents need to contact pupils or vice versa during the school day, this should be done via the usual school procedure of contacting the school office via phone or email.

# Dear Parent/Carer

In accordance with our mobile phone policy, if your child is bringing in a mobile phone to school on a regular basis, please could you sign the form below to give your permission for your child to do this and remind them of our school policy.

- Your child needs to bring their phone to the school office first thing in the morning before they go their classroom.
- The school bears no responsibility for the loss or damage to a mobile phone.
- Your child's phone should be appropriately marked so that they can recognise it.
- Any phones brought into school must not have applications (including Social Media) or software downloaded onto them where the pupil's age falls below that required by age restrictions of that application or software.
- Should your child be found using their phone inappropriately or have inappropriate applications/software on the phone, the school reserves the right to withdraw this privilege and they will no longer be able to bring their phone into school.
