Being Organised

Welcome back to school! We hope you have had a lovely break and are ready for some new and exciting challenges this term.

We are very pleased to see all your children returning to school in their fully named uniforms (please see the school uniform policy if you have any queries.) Please make sure that your child brings their coat to school each day and wears sensible, low heeled, plain black shoes (no trainers, skate shoes or boots please). This Term's Learning

We want our pupils to enjoy their learning and we aim to make it as enjoyable as possible! We expect the children to try their best but we also want them to have fun.



This term's essential question is "How can WE protect endangered animals?" and our immersive learning will be based around why some animals are in danger of extinction, the habitats they live in and the ways that we can help them.

English

This term the children will research and write their own facts about endangered animals and also learn about stories from other cultures.

They will continue to practise their handwriting and phonics daily and to bring home weekly spelling lists to practise at home. Grammar work will focus on sentence structure and punctuation.

Mathematics

In maths this term the children will continue to practise a range of calculation strategies. They will learn about number, money, measures, shape and space and data handling and apply this knowledge in solving real life problems through our challenge lessons. Our daily "Marvellous Maths" sessions will focus on consolidating essential mental maths skills.

Science

We will find out about a range of animals (including humans) and their habitats, look at parts of the human body and related senses and fins out about simple animal food chains. As always we will learn to work scientifically by observing, questioning and evaluating.



Geography

We will use maps, atlases and globes to identify and name continents and oceans and look at the differences and similarities between where we live and the places where endangered animals are found.

Art & Design

We will study the work of the artist Henri Rousseau and create our own artwork as a response. We will look at various types of logo and design our own.



Music

We will study Camille Saint-Saens' "Carnival of the Animals" and use a variety of instruments to create our own music to represent animals.

Computing

We will learn about algorithms and produce our own for others to follow. We will also learn how to keep safe on the internet.



RE

This term we will learn about stories associated with Buddhism and the meanings behind them. We will also look at festivals in our community and, in particular, consider what Easter means to Christians.



PSHE

We will think about feelings and emotions and how we can express these to others in an appropriate way. We will look at how to make positive relationships with others around us.
