Single Equality Scheme

Every Spring term we write to all parents about the Single Equality Scheme. This addresses our statutory duties in relation to race, disability, gender and promoting community cohesion and covers staff, pupils and people using the services of the school such as parents. The Single Equality Scheme also addresses the legislation relating to religion or belief, age and sexual orientation and includes our priorities and actions to eliminate discrimination and harassment for these equality areas.

The scheme requires us to produce an annual report on our progress, looking at the impact of our actions. A "Single Equality Scheme Guide for Parents" is attached to this week's newsletter which includes the report on our progress towards our key objectives for 2019 – 2020. The guide also asks anyone interested in being part of our ongoing consultation to get in touch with one of the Senior Leadership Team – if you are interested, we would be delighted to hear from you.

Full payment is needed by the above date. If it is not paid in full by this date, we will cancel your child's place and refund any money you have already paid (less the deposit) with immediate effect.

You can pay as much or as little as you want anytime up to the final date. Please pay online at schoolmoney.co.uk as we no longer accept cash or cheques. Click into the amount box and change the total payment to the amount you'd like to pay. If you cannot pay online, please ask at the office for a Paypoint barcode which you can use to pay cash at a local Paypoint retailer. Thank you.

Healthy snacks

We are a healthy eating school and would like to remind you that crisps and biscuits/snack bars are not allowed at breaktimes. If your child is in EYFS or KS1 they will be given a piece of fruit or a vegetable under the Government's school fruit and vegetable scheme. Children in KS2 can bring in fruit, vegetable sticks, rice cakes, crackers or breadsticks or buy a healthy snack from the tuck shop (items are 50p).

The Switch is a hybrid console released by popular video game company Nintendo in 2017. 
