Dogs

There have been a few incidents recently relating to dogs on the school grounds.

Whilst we realise that most dogs who come to school are very good around people and, most importantly, children, it is impossible to guarantee how they'll react in every situation. Some children are very nervous around dogs and it is unfair to put them in this position. Also, a child could accidentally stand on a dog's paw which could cause the dog to react. In addition to all this, we also have to be sure that we do not have any dogs toileting on the school grounds.

Can we therefore ask you please to ensure that **NO** dogs (even ones that can be carried) are brought onto school grounds or tied up somewhere inappropriate. It is extremely hot at the moment, so please do make sure that, if you do leave your dog outside the school grounds, it is in a cool and shady place.

Late Arrivals

Recently we have found that quite a number of children are arriving late in the morning.

Please ensure that your child arrives at school between 8.45am and 9am as the school day begins at 9. If your child arrives late, the class is disrupted and your child may not find it easy to settle into their work and will have missed the important social time first thing in the morning with their friends. Registers close at 9am and if your child arrives after 9.30am, they will be marked down as an unauthorised absence for the whole morning in line with the DfE guidance. If you run late regularly, you could consider using our Breakfast club which starts at 8am and costs only £2 to include breakfast.

Debts

Please ensure that **ALL** money owing for lunches, nursery sessions, Breakfast club, trips, swimming, etc is paid by the last week of term.

Music lessons in September


