Dear Parents and Carers,

I think it's fair to say that there are few schools which were built with the motor car in mind. The situation here at Alverton is typical of that faced by the majority of schools in the county and beyond, with limited parking on heavily populated residential streets and a few bottlenecks thrown in for good measure. As a result the beginning and end of the school day often presents parents, residents and staff with the some of the most challenging issues we face over the week.

Running late and looking for somewhere to park, irate residents who have had their drive blocked, together with questionable levels of courtesy from other drivers all add up to increased stress levels and an unhappy experience. More importantly however, all of these factors create a very dangerous cocktail for our pupils at either end of the school day. Frustrated motorists driving (and reversing!) at speed on narrow roads simply does not mix well with 300+ children trying to leave or arrive at school.

I am told that for almost as long as the school has been here this traffic issue has been discussed and that lots of ideas have been put forward to change it but with no long term success. As Head of the school I do not want to wait until an accident forces a change for the better. The school has a responsibility to act in order to improve the situation and so do you as parents. We simply have to reduce the impact of traffic around the school at peak times in order to improve the safety for our pupils, and we have to make that change now.

There are a number of ideas currently being explored in order to improve the situation for everyone. These include remodelling the entrance to the school and creating an additional car park on part of the Year 5/6 playground, reinstating the walking bus and offering incentives for children who walk to school, having crossing patrols at key points, etc. Before we move forward with any of these, though, we need to create a School Travel Plan which may help us to secure funding and support from the key partners at local and county level.

To this end we would ask ALL parents to complete the attached questionnaire please and send it back in to school. All completed questionnaires received will be entered into a Free Prize Draw and every child who returns the questionnaire will receive a House Point.

We really need your support in order to tackle this problem once and for all. The single biggest help you can give is to not drive your car to school. If you absolutely have to drive, then please do not drive into Toltuff Crescent but park a short distance away and walk.


## Help! More singers needed for the Alverton School Choir
