



FOUNDATION DEGREE IN TEACHING AND LEARNING

Are you currently working or volunteering with children or young people and seeking to extend your knowledge and understanding of Teaching and Learning?

WHAT COULD I GAIN?

The aim of the foundation degree is to provide students with a knowledge base that will enable them to reflect on the skills they need to be effective practitioners in an educational setting.

This degree will provide students with experiences that could further their careers in services to support young people or in education.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

UNDER 21 YEARS

32 UCAS tariff points. This is equivalent to one A Level grade D. Other qualifications may also be applicable.

OVER 21 YEARS

If you do not have any of the above qualifications your application is still welcome. We take into account your previous knowledge and life experiences, both inside and outside employment.

An Enhanced Disclosure & Barring Service (DBS) check is required for this course, plus an occupational health check.

FOUNDATION DEGREE IN TEACHING AND LEARNING (FDTL)

YEAR TWO

- Reflective journal
- Meeting the individual needs of children and young people with specific learning difficulties
- Behaviour for learning
- Planning, assessment and evaluating learning
- Supporting teaching and learning
- Work-based independent study

KEY FEATURES OF THE COURSE:

- Completing students can progress to a “top-up” third year of study in a BA Professional Practice.
- At the start of the academic year, students are required to be working or volunteering in a setting of their choice. This must be with children or young people between the ages of 0-19 years for a minimum of 10 hours per week.

WHEN DOES THE FOUNDATION DEGREE TAKE PLACE?

The foundation degree takes place during term time only on a designated day; this day remains the same for the two years. There are approximately 30 taught days per academic year.

Course fees for academic year 2017-18 are £6,890 per year. *Please note: All Foundation Degree modules listed reflect the taught programme for the year commencing 2017; they are subject to annual review.
