




# Kerris, Lanyon and Trencrom Homework Autumn Term 1 - Stone Age to Iron Age (Focus - Stone Age)



<b>English and Communication</b>	Write a list of jobs people would have done during the Stone age. Can you list at least 10?	Imagine you have been whisked back to pre-historic Britain. If you could take one person and one object with you, who and what would they be, and why?	Write a 7 - day diary, imagining you are a child back in the Stone Age. What can you hear, see, taste and smell? How do you feel?	From what you have learnt - write an acrostic poem using the word Stone Age.
<b>Maths and Problem Solving</b>	Practise and learn your times tables.  Year 3: 2, 3, 5 and 10  Year 4: 4, 6.....	Stone Age people did not have numbers the same as we do now. Archaeologists have found they used different symbols. Can you create you own symbols for numbers?	When you have researched and created your Stone Age recipe. Can you calculate how much it will cost to get all of the ingredients?	 <p>A family of woolly mammoth are all different heights. Can you order their heights smallest to largest?</p>
<b>Humanities</b>	Create a poster with your 10 favourite facts about the Stone Age on.	Research Skara Brae and create a leaflet on what you find out.	Using any way you like, create a time line to show how long ago the Stone Age was. Can you work out how many years ago it was?	Draw a picture of what your cave would have looked like in the Stone Age. Make sure you label the different parts.
<b>Science and the Outdoor Environment</b>	Research and find out how a fossil is made and making a poster explaining it.	Could you visit a local site such as Carn Brea? Write an account of your visit. What did you see, can you draw what you saw?	Imagine you are an archaeologist. Place small objects in sand, soil or rice and ask someone to find them using a small brush (like a toothbrush or make up brush) or teaspoon. Ask someone to hide objects for you to find.	Make a sculpture outdoors using natural materials, including stone, wood and vegetation. Look at Andy Goldsworthy's art for inspiration. Take a picture of it to show at school.

Choose one area of the grid to complete each week for homework. Complete a new task and hand it in on every Wednesday. You can do them in any order and can do more than one each week if you like but try to make sure that you have done at least one from each row. You can always choose how to present your work and can use ICT if you want to. If your homework is not something that you can bring in to school (e.g. going exploring) then ask an adult to sign the section of the homework grid or maybe bring in a photo.
