Our learning about dinosaurs this term will culminate in our traditional KS1 Christmas performance. This year it will be 'A Dinosaur

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<u>English</u>

Our English this term will begin with caption & labels for dinosaurs before moving onto to dinosaur fact files and instruction writing.

<u>History</u>

We will be looking at timelines of the different eras in which dinosaurs roamed the Earth (the Triassic, Jurassic and Cretaceous periods) and learning about Mary Anning and her contribution to our understanding of dinosaurs.

Geography

We will learn about the about the continents and oceans of our planet, how they have formed and what dinosaurs roamed them.

<u>Science</u>

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We will be sorting and classifying dinosaurs (and other animals) and learning about diets and how to stay healthy.

<u>Music</u>

In Music we will be using different instruments to explore rhythm and singing some dinosaur songs!



<u>Maths</u>

In maths this term we be developing our understanding of number, place value and calculation strategies - all

In Art we will be using the work of Henri Rousseau as inspiration for our own dinosaur collages and also making scientific drawings of fossils.

<u>PE</u>

Linking to our science learning, we will make, try and evaluate our own healthy fruit dinosaurs!

In religious education, we will be learning what churches are and about Jesus and Christmas.

We will be linking our learning to 'New Beginnings' in our classrooms, establishing our class rules and thinking about the 'Rule of Law'.
