A Night at the Museum



Anyone who came along to the Key Stage 2 exhibition "A Night at the Museum" this week will agree that it was an evening of which everyone involved can be extremely proud.

From living gods to Cleopatra, shadow puppets to embalming or shabtis to shadufs, this was a true celebration of the children's fabulous work on Ancient Egypt this term.

As you will know, we follow the principles of project-based learning and an end-of-term

exhibition is a key aspect of this as the children strive to produce high quality work for a real purpose. Touring the classrooms, visitors were able to see many such examples, whether written, artistic or in the children's articulation of their





knowledge. A particular highlight for many was the flashmob, for which the children have been secretly practising for weeks.

Mrs O'Rourke, our Key Stage 2 leader who masterminded the event said, "This was certainly our most inspiring challenge task this term! It was incredible to see such a child-led event reach such a professional outcome".

Something which particularly impressed our staff was the way in which the children worked together this week across classes and year groups to help each other and prepare their museum.

Support for the event was overwhelming, both in respect of the

number of family and friends who came along and in their lovely comments and appreciation of everyone's efforts.

Mr Higgs said, "What a fantastic culmination of the project! The children all got a lot from the exhibition and is was great to see so many people support
