As the term heads towards Christmas we will of course be focusing on the nativity story. The children will be performing their play to an audience and learning lots of songs to entertain you all with. In the classroom we anticipte Santa's workshop being a very busy place with children writing lists and cards, wrapping presents and delivering them around the classroom.
