FRIDAY NEWS

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A very warm welcome back to all of our parents and carers for the start of our Autumn Term.

It has been a busy Summer for the school as we once again became a building site for the entire six weeks of the summer break. The work which was carried out, although extensive, will be largely un-noticed unless you are extremely familiar with the building. It included a new hall ceiling and lighting, two new classroom ceilings and emergency lighting being fitted and renewed in large parts of the school. The builders from Lorne Stewart, and in particular John who led the team, were excellent and took a great deal of care of in order to make sure the school was well looked after. Inevitably, there was a huge amount of work required to get the school ready in a short space of time (the builders left late last Friday night), and I am indebted to Alan Penn our caretaker and the cleaners who worked tirelessly to get the school ready to open on time.

I am equally grateful to all of the staff who came in to school during the final week of the holidays and over last weekend to lend a hand in getting the school ready, as well as transforming their classrooms into stimulating learning environments ready for the topic launch on Tuesday morning. Their hard work was certainly worthwhile

however, as children returned to find themselves taking a trip around the galaxy in the space dome to start to answer the question "Are the aliens coming?". Meanwhile, Key Stage 2 were transported to Egypt and spent the first day as trainee archaeologists under the direction of the famous Howard Carter (or least a distant relation of his) excavating ancient sites and exploring the dark burial chambers of the Bodrifty pyramid with torches and disturbing the sleeping Pharaoh. I don't remember my first day, or indeed any day, of school being as exciting as this!



The children have all settled back into school life really quickly and, as always, are a credit to you. I am very grateful to all of our parents who have made sure that the

children arrived back to school looking so smart in their uniform. It is much appreciated, thank you.

Last week saw all of our staff involved in some joint training with our new partners from Pensans and Newlyn



Schools looking at how we can continue to improve the guality of the education we provide through the immersive and project based approach. This collaborative approach was very successful and was a really positive way to mark the beginning of our new Penlee Academy Trust which came into being on September 1st 2015.

There is a great deal planned this year both in terms of learning projects and the development of our school overall. We will continue with the action plan we set up in response to the 360° review in the Spring, focusing on improving the outdoor spaces and playgrounds as well as a whole range of other improvements. Progress with this plan has been very good and I am confident that we will achieve most of our goals before the next review. An updated copy of the development overview is included later in this newsletter.

Of course, we continue to be measured largely on our results and I am delighted to report that last Summer saw our pupils achieve the best results in the school's history in terms of both

progress and attainment at the end of Key Stage 2. Full details will appear next week on the school website and as a Parent Guide.

APPLYING FOR A SCHOOL PLACE FOR SEPTEMBER 2016

If you have a child born between 1st September 2011 and 31st August 2012 you need to apply for a school place in a Reception class for starting in September 2016. The deadline for applications is **15th January 2016.** The easiest way is to apply online at www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions. ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

If your child is unwell or will not be attending school it is your responsibility to contact the school on the first day of absence no later than 9.30am (there is an answering machine if you wish to leave a message before 8am). If we have not heard from you by this time we will need to telephone home to ascertain the nature of their absence. This is in line with the Government's policy on attendance. Please note that any child who is ill with sickness or an upset stomach should remain away from school for 48 hours after the last episode of illness.

Height & weight screening for Reception & Year 6 children

Next month the children in Reception and Year 6 will be weighed and measured by the school nurses. All children in these years will be receiving a booklet and "opt out" form about this. If you do **NOT** wish your child to be weighed or measured you must return the form to the office. By not returning the form, we assume you give your permission.
