Attendance

Please could we remind you of the information we published last term in the Friday News on 19th July regarding term time holidays.

We are well aware that the financial savings of taking holidays in term time can be significant, and that for many people this means the difference between having a family holiday in a desirable destination or not. We also know that many of our families are involved in seasonal work that prevents them from taking time off in the school holidays. This is why, as a school, we have tried to manage the term-time holiday situation without resorting to fines. However, the current situation is untenable.

What many parents don't realise is that if our attendance significantly drops, as it has done, and the school is not doing everything in its power to improve this situation, the consequences for the school can be very serious indeed and the repercussions could significantly affect the way the school is run and its overall ethos.

Governors of the school have therefore, extremely reluctantly, taken the decision to follow other local schools in adopting the Local Authorities guidance on fixed penalty fines for holidays taken in term time with effect from September 2019.

If you decide to take your child out of school, without permission, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may refer the matter to Cornwall Council who as the issuing officer may decide to take legal action against you. A penalty notice can be issued under Section 444A and 444B of the Education Act 1996. This carries a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Fines are issued per parent/carer, per child. Failure to pay the penalty notice may result in Court action. Persistent absences not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates Court, leading to fines up to £2,500 and/or custodial sentences.

We would therefore, once again, ask parents not to book holidays in term time next year and remind everyone that under the DfE's rules we can only authorise term-time absence in exceptional circumstances. Please note that none of the money taken in fines from these fixed penalty notices comes to the school.

Date reminder

Please note school is closed on Monday 28th October and Tuesday 29th October for INSET days so the first day back after half term will be **Wednesday 30th October.** Half term is 21st to 25th October.

Bosigran sharing assembly - postponed

Bosigran's sharing assembly was to have been on 11th October but has been postponed until the Spring term.

Later this term Year 4 will be making beautiful Christmas lanterns to go on show at Trengwainton Gardens on 6th and 7th December. Due to its huge popularity, last year the team at Trengwainton took the decision to limit the number of people going to the Lantern Walk, so everyone has to book a ticket to gain entry, including the schools involved in the lantern making.

Reception & Year 6 health check booklets

All Reception and Year 6 children should have brought a health check booklet home with them this week. You only need to return the form if you wish to opt OUT of the health checks that will be carried out. These include height and weight screening for Reception and Year 6 children which will be carried out this term.

Water bottles

Please can you ensure that your child brings a water bottle to school with them each day. It is important that the children drink plenty of water.

Alverton water bottles

We now have reusable water bottles for sale at the office priced £1.50 (cash only please). They are in house colours (red, blue, green & yellow) so please ask your child which one they belong to so they can have the correct coloured bottle.

PE kit

A large percentage of children have not had PE kit in school this week. All children from Years 1-6 should have a PE kit in school all week. This should consist of a pair of red shorts, white polo shirt or Tshirt, red zipped Alverton top, black tracksuit bottoms and a pair of trainers. These should be named and in a named PE bag or other bag. Although there are set days during the week for PE, other sessions can take place at any time during the week and children should not be disadvantaged by the not having appropriate kit to wear.

Mini Singers is Cormwal's County Choir for boys and girls aged 3 - 8.

The Cornwall Music Education hub has extended the Cornwall County Choir family to include younger singers from ages 3 to 8 years old. The Mini Singers and Junior Mini Singers will take place in two locations: Penzance (weekly during term time) and Truro (monthly during term time).

Penzance Weekly Sessions - Tuesdays

Mini Singers (for children aged 3 - 5 years)

4pm – 4.30pm weekly on Tuesdays at St Mary's C of E Primary School, Redinnick Place, Penzance. Children to be accompanied by an adult for the duration of the session.

Junior Mini Singers (for children aged 6 - 8 years)

4.30pm – 5.15pm weekly on Tuesdays at St Mary's C of E Primary School, Redinnick Place, Penzance.
Parents not required to stay for the sessions.

What does it cost to join Mini Singers and Junior Mini Singers?

Choir members pay a termly membership fee which is subsidised by the Cornwall Music Education Hub. The current termly fee is £30 for Mini Singers (10×30 minute sessions for children aged 3-5 years) and £35 for Junior Mini Singers (10×45 minute weekly sessions for children aged 6-8 years). Mini Singers County Choir membership includes a Cornwall County Choirs T-Shirt.

Places for these groups are limited and pre-booking is essential.

Children aged 3-5 must be accompanied during the sessions.
