Computing Curriculum

Computing is the new title for the previous Information, Communication and Technology curriculum (ICT) as identified by the department for Education.

IT supports all areas of learning at Alverton School. Each of the classrooms has an LED screen and Apple TV, or interactive whiteboard, to aid in the delivery of the curriculum and also has direct access to a shared set of iPads. With the introduction of mobile technology, children are now able to share their learning with the whole class using Apple TV to 'air play' their work - a wonderful tool for sharing examples of great work or modelling a task in group settings. There are still some PCs, laptops and other ICT equipment located within the school that are used to further support the children's learning.

The provision of iPads within each classroom has greatly enhanced the children's learning experience. The children are now able to have instant access to the online world in their own classroom and at any time during the day. The suite of Apps available to the children is under constant review by the teachers and computing coordinator as new and exciting technology becomes available. Many of the Apps children have access to, whilst on the school site, are also available for use at home which can be a great help in consolidating children's learning.

How does it work?

Our curriculum is broken down into three key areas: *Computer Science, Information Technology* and *Digital Literacy* - within which **Online Safety** features heavily.

Computer Science covers the programming aspects of the curriculum where children will be taught to understand basic algorithms and learn how to detect and correct errors by debugging their programs.

Information Technology enables children to create, organise, store, manipulate and retrieve data through the use of a variety of software (including the internet).

Digital Literacy learning focuses on the use of information technology beyond school. Using technology safely and respectfully, as well as understanding the opportunities for collaboration and communication that digital technology can provide.
