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As I am sure you are aware, we have been working really hard to move the school forward over a wide range of areas in light of the 360° Whole School Review published in April of last year. I am really proud of how far we have been able to move forward in a relatively short period of time by building upon the many strengths and unique character which defines our school.

When we look back across the year, there will inevitably be some weeks which stand out as being major milestones in our journey and I believe that the past few days will certainly stand out in this regard.

On Monday, Mrs O'Rourke and Mrs Knowles were recommended by external assessors to become Specialist Leaders in Education (SLEs). This is a national award which is highly regarded and much sought after and I am delighted that two of our staff have been recognised in this way for their undoubted individual abilities and talents. I am certain that both teachers would say that this is also a recognition of the hard work, achievements and support of the whole staff team. Mrs O'Rourke and Mrs Knowles will now deliver training and support schools interested in adopting a similar approach to teaching and learning.

As if this wasn't enough, you may remember our exciting news last term that, alongside Newlyn and Pensans schools as the Penlee Academy Trust, we had been approached by Eos Education about becoming a regional "hub". This means that other schools, interested in our teaching and learning and keen to find out what our REAL Project approach looks like in practice, would be able to visit us for open days and training.

Eos Education is a highly regarded and innovative alliance of schools which works with schools across Britain and further afield to help improve educational outcomes for all young people and ensure they are ready for the modern world. We were delighted that the work we have done in adapting their principles to our setting has been recognised in this way and we are proud to have been accredited as one of only six hubs across the country.

On Tuesday and Wednesday this week, our three schools welcomed visitors from primary schools across Cornwall to the Cornwall Eos Regional Hub Launch. On Tuesday afternoon, more than thirty teachers and governors visited Alverton, where they enjoyed a workshop on challenge-based learning followed by the opportunity to tour the classrooms and experience challenge-based learning in action.

The feedback we have received has been overwhelmingly positive and full of praise for the things we are

doing here. The children were amazing - there was a real buzz of learning and activity right across the school and once again we are so proud of them all. We must also say a big thank you to all of our staff who worked very hard to prepare for the event and who have been widely praised.

Well done to everyone involved. We are now looking forward with great anticipation to our next event!
