Christmas managed to pay a visit to you all.




As always, we have a busy term ahead and have hit the ground running with each phase launching

their projects. On Monday our Lower Key Stage 2 children had a visit from Shelterbox to begin to answer their Essential Question "How could you survive?". The visit has inspired them to try to raise enough money this term to fund at least one box. Key

Stage 1 had a virtual trip to Australia to find out "What goes on Down Under?" and even managed to hold a barbeque in the pouring rain! The Early Years had an incredible day with John Brolly who brought along his magical story bag from which

emerged the most amazing and unusual objects which the children used to tell stories. Upper Key Stage 2 are planning their launch day for Monday and it is sounding equally exciting.





We have had really positive feedback from many parents and residents to the traffic control measures we have put in place. My thanks go to all of those parents who made a special effort to increase the volume of pedestrian and vehicular traffic for the crossing patrol survey conducted by the local authority. Whilst there is clearly a recognised need for some form of safe crossing point at the end of Toltuff Crescent, It may be an uphill struggle to convince the Local Authority to pay for any changes. We will await an outcome to the survey conducted yesterday before we plan our next move.

In the meantime, if any parents felt able to write a letter or email in support of our call for safety measures at this busy junction I would be very grateful. If a significant number of parents express a concern, we are much more likely to achieve a change; this is a great opportunity for us to demonstrate how a strong school community working together can affect positive changes.
