IN-APP PAYMENTS - Instagram allows payments for products directly through the app. It operates under the same rules as Facebook Payments, which state that if you are under the age of 18, you can only use this feature with the involvement of a parent or guardian.

Twitter, hashtags are also an extremely prominent tool nstagram and with that comes dangers for your child, person may use a seemingly innocent hashtag with one cular thing in mind, and before you know it hundreds of ople could be using the same hashtag for something nappropriate or dangerous that your child certainly shouldn't be exposed to.







Tips for Parents 4

RESTRICT DIRECT **MESSAGES**

If your child receives a message from somebody they do not know, encourage them not to accept their message equest and 'block' this person; this is the only way to stop them messaging your child again.

LOOK OUT FOR #ADS

REMOVE PAYMENT METHODS

u are happy for your child to have a card associated n their Instagram account, we suggest adding a PIN n needs to be entered before making a payment; th so help prevent unauthorised purchases. This can b added in the payment settings tab.

SCROLLING

Instagram added a 'You've completely caught up' message in late 2018. This message breaks up the feed and notifies you when you are up to date and there are no more new posts from followers. This features is enabled automatically, but have the conversation with your child about how much time they are spending on the app and set healthy time limits.

PROTECT THEIR PERSONAL INFORMATION

USE A PRIVATE ACCOUNT

By default, any image or video your child uploads to tagram is visible to anyone. A private account means the u have to approve a request if somebody wants to follow ou and only people you approve will see your posts and videos.

FILTER INAPPROPRIATE **COMMENTS**

Instagram has an 'anti-bullying' filter, which hides comments relating to a person's appearance or character, as well as threats to a person's wellbeing or health. The filter will also alert instagram to repeated problems so they can take action against the user if necessary. This is an automatic filter, but it can be turned off. Make sure it is turned on in the app's settings.

TURN OFF SHARING

Even though this feature will not stop people from taking screenshots, it will stop others being able to directly share photos and videos from a story as a essage to another user. This feature can be turned off in the settings. We also recommend turning off the lature which automatically shares photos and videos from a story to a Facebook account.

Parents Evenings - KS1 and KS2

Our Parents Evenings this term will be held in the week beginning **Monday 18th November** from 3.30—6.30 pm and we are really looking forward to meeting you and discussing your child's progress.

Our system for booking appointments through the eschools facility on our school website (www.alverton.org.uk) is now open so if you haven't yet booked an appointment, please do so as soon as possible as slots are filling up fast.

You will previously have been sent log in details for eschools. If you are unsure what this is, please ask at the office and they will arrange for new details to be sent to you. These details will be needed in order to go online and book the appointment slot that suits you best.

If you have had a review meeting with Mrs Hughes and your child's class teacher, you don't need to book an appointment.

Log ins

Some parents are getting a little confused about log in details for our online payments system and our website. Let us help you!

Schoolmoney (Eduspot) (eduspot.co.uk) is used for online payments only and you will need your mobile number, email address and a password that has been sent to you. It is a computer generated one which you cannot change but will always be the same so please save it somewhere safe. You can then pay for trips, camp, swimming, etc securely with your debit or credit card. When signing in, please choose the 'schoolmoney for parent login' at the bottom.

Eschools (via the Alverton school website) is used for booking parents evenings twice a year. You will need your user name (your first name and surname with a full stop in between) e.g. john.smith (all lower case) and a password which we can reset in the office for you if you lose it.

Year 5 camp deposits

If your child would like to go to Porthpean next June, the deadline for the deposit of £30 (paid online) is Friday 22nd November. Please ensure you pay by then to reserve a place.

Absence from school

If your child is unwell or will not be attending school it is your responsibility to contact the school on the first day of absence no later than 9.30am (there is an answering machine if you wish to leave a message before 8am). If we have not heard from you by this time we will need to telephone home to ascertain the nature of their absence. This is in line with the Government's policy on attendance. Please note that any child who is ill with sickness or an upset stomach should remain away from school for 48 hours after the last episode of illness.
