Another near miss - what if it was your child?

Even without our school being sited here, Toltuff Crescent was not designed to have a large number of cars drive in and out of it twice a day. It is simply too narrow, especially for many of the larger cars currently available in today's market.

Add to this equation 330 children plus parents leaving and arriving at the site on foot and the potential for an accident increases significantly, every day. Then of course we could factor in bad weather, poor visibility and, dare I say it, poor driving and we're talking about *when* rather than *if* an accident will occur.

For the past couple of years we have been working really hard to try to improve this situation by:

- Campaigning for and funding our Lollipop Lady so that children can cross the main road safely on foot at a time when crossing patrols are being cut across the county;
- Creating a new car park to remove the dangerous mixture of cars and people in the old staff car park;
- Having a member of staff stand at the end of Toltuff Crescent asking parents not to drive into the cul-de-sac;
- Highlighting where cars can park as an alternative to being 30 yard from the school gates;
- Frequent appeals via the newsletter etc, etc.

The vast majority of you have supported this by parking a short distance from the school and walking the final part of the journey because you recognise the dangers and want to support the school in keeping our children safe. To those people I'd like to say a big thank you.

There are of course some people who have a genuine need to drive close to the school at peak times, for example those with disabilities and parents dropping off children at the Day Nursery.

There are, however, what feels like an increasing number of cars arriving to pick up and drop off children every day who, despite our best efforts, still insist on driving up to the school gates. On days when we can't provide a member of staff to stand at the end of the road, the number of cars outside school is significantly higher, presumably because drivers think that they can 'get away with' parking as close to the school as possible.

We have had two very near misses this week. The first was when a car reversed back onto Toltuff Crescent from the Private Road (the one with the large sign saying no access or reversing) and narrowly missed two children crossing the road behind them. The second was a parent driving out of the staff car park again narrowly missing a parent and child.

There are two safety points arising from these near misses. The first is to make it clear that **the new staff car park is not to be used as a drop off or waiting area for our parents and families at the start and end of the school day**. There are three dedicated drop off bays in the new car park for the parents using the private nursery as they can no longer drive into the old staff car park. New signage has been ordered to make this clearer.

The second is to request, once again, that if at all possible **people collecting or dropping off children at peak times avoid driving into Toltuff Crescent**. As I am frequently told, it is a public road and cars with valid road tax are perfectly entitled to drive up and down the road as they wish. However, we are a school community and in the last survey we carried out, it was clearly the wish of the vast majority of our community that Toltuff Crescent is as car-free as possible when children are being dropped off or collected. We would really appreciate everyone's help in keeping all our children safe and would ask you to share this message with everyone who comes to drop off or collect your children.
